


Untitled, a special project Marieta Chirulescu









In this commissioned project by the Romanian-born, Berlin-based artist Marieta Chirulescu, laserchrome prints, inkjet images, photocopies and small watercolors are presented as diglitzed readymades, after being treated on the uncleaned glass plate of a scanner. These digitally transformed images function as indexical traces of the originals, which the artist appropriates and considers as analogue matrices. Often using advanced reproduction technologies to excavate and extract details from previous materials as well as play with the supposed transparency of the device, Chirulescu uses her images to test the infinite possibilities between the original and the copy, unicity and repetition, analogue integrity and digital fragmentation.

Biography

MARIETA CHIRULESCU (b. 1974, Romania) lives and works in Berlin. Solo exhibitions of her work took place at Galeria Fools, Napies; White Color, London; Konstreenin. Ninnberg: Kunsthaller Barle; Mickly Solohert, Berlin; and Kunsthaller Maks.
